1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The primary objective of the College is to impart quality teacher-education to student-teachers so as to enable them to transform their knowledge and skills towards the development of society.

Objectives realized-2012:

The items 1-12 listed on the Plan of Action above were carried out.

Objectives partially realized:

Construction of the Badminton Court is still in progress.

Other activities:

- **Library Upgraded:** The College has automated the Library since 2009 with the installation of the management software (ILM) KOHA. To get access for INFLIBNET is the desire of the college and yet to be achieved in short duration.
- **Equipments :**
 - i. Power back up system (Electronic) has been installed in the college.
 - ii. New Scales and Apparatus for Psychological tests and experiments were bought in order to update the Psychological Laboratory.
 - iii. Reprographic system has been upgraded in the Institution
 - iv. Teaching Aids have been furnished for improving the teaching-learning environment.
- **Value Education :** Value education is very much encouraged in the College. The practicality of value education is reflected through the dress code, the activities and other academic sessions. Various other programmes are organized to highlight the importance of values and how they should be imparted as part of school education.
- **Computer Laboratory:** Besides applying for more computers from NEC through the Government, the College as always encourages the student-teachers to avail the following facilities for the maximum use:
 - i. The 24 Point Broadband Internet,
 - ii. Wifi internet Connection and
 - iii. Multimedia equipments

The College maintains a service-provider who is available at short notice.

- **Extension Programmes:** With the intention to reach out to far-flung areas, the College makes provisions to carry out extension work in conducting training to the school-teachers in the line of teaching skills by teacher-educators and giving chances to the student-teachers for practising their skills to the students of that particular school. It is also a kind of an exposure for the student-teachers before joining the teaching profession.
 - **Maintaining a collaborative work:** The college maintained a collaborative spirit with the Block Resource Centre, in giving training to the SSA Teachers of the Lower Primary and Upper Primary Schools from Myllem Block. This rapport was maintained with the spirit of service to the society.
- 2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG):**

The Principal and the Vice-Principal were members of the B.Ed Syllabus Revision Committee with the Department of Education, NEHU, Shillong for the Revised Structure of B.Ed Programme under Semester System. The Committee met a number of times during the year to work out the structure of the B.Ed Programme.

The Principal being one of the members of the Board of Under-Graduate Studies (BUGS) in Education NEHU, attended the meeting for the Final Structure of Under-Graduate Courses (B.A. & B.Ed) and the Calendar for the Under-Graduate Programme to be implemented for the Semester System in the affiliated Colleges.

3. **Innovations in curricular design and transaction:**

- Facilities were offered in the College for the use of ICT in frequent mode for the Teacher-Educators as well as for the Student-Teachers, in demonstrating classes and in teaching-learning purposes.
- After the workshop on Co-operative Learning, Student-Teachers were encouraged to integrate the learning with the skills of micro-teaching during their Internship Practice Teaching and Final Practice Teaching which is highly appreciated because of its effectiveness.
- The College always stressed on the use of low-cost, no-cost and best out-of-waste materials while preparing teaching aids. This is maintained in the College with the help of a workshop on Preparation of Teaching Aids.
- Self study, group discussion and group work, peer seminars, compare and contrast are regular features of curriculum transaction at SMCTE besides the usual practice. They have been found to be effective in helping students, particularly students who are weak in their studies.
- Monitorial system is another feature used especially during face-to-face interaction or discussion on a particular topic. This is done especially to equalize the freshers and the deputed teachers. It was found really effective.
- The Institute took the initiative to equip student-teachers with the basic knowledge of handling the English language. This is done by providing English remedial teaching for those who are interested in the subject and who feel the need for it.

4. **Inter-disciplinary programmes started:** Due to time constraint, the College cannot introduce inter- disciplinary programmes. At present in our particular situation, the nature and duration of the B.Ed do not favour such initiatives.

5. **Examination reforms implemented:** The College continually evaluates the performance of the students in a comprehensive manner, specifically for the internal assessment which includes both scholastic and co-scholastic aspects. The external examination is carried out by NEHU. The College conducts annual B.Ed. Examination prior to the University Examination in the month of October with a view to ensure that the teacher trainees strengthen the knowledge they have received as well as being well-prepared for the Examination.

6. **Candidates qualified: NET/SLET/GATE etc:** Majority of the Teachers are NET qualified.

7. **Initiative towards faculty development programme:**

- *6th February:* The staff (Ms E. B. Myrthong and Ms D. J. Kharnongrum) with student-teachers attended an Interaction Session with Azim Premji Foundation Team (APF) in collaboration with the Centre for Development of North East Region (CEDNER) IIM Shillong on the “Development challenges in the North East”.
- *13th-14th February:* For the commencement of the new academic session, Orientation Programme was conducted in the College by the Faculty Members on different topics for professional enhancement.
- *21st February:* A Session on “Attitude” was given by Sir Isias for the Faculty Members and Student-Teachers to energize them for the training.

- *16th - 17th March:* A two-day workshop on Teaching-Aids was participated by the Teacher-Educators as well as the Student-Teachers in order to encourage them to use the low cost and no cost teaching aids for teaching. Br Maurice, a Christian brother and a specialist in the field gave the training followed by the demonstration classes and practical work.
- *22nd March:* Ms Darihun Kharnongrum and two other students Barihunlang Wankhar and Babetlin Kharshandi attended the “*State Level seminar on adverse impact of early marriage on health and livelihood of women*” at Don Bosco Youth Centre, Shillong.
- *25th April:* The Principal and Ms E. B. Myrthong attended an open forum for Heads of Educational Institutions on ‘Mental Health of Adolescents’ where various factors affecting the mental health of adolescents were discussed. Topics such as Stressors in Adolescence, Substance Abuse, Guidance and Counselling in Schools as well as Practical Experiences as Counsellors were shared during the sessions. It was organized by SAN-KER, concerned that poor mental health could be a contributory factor in the poor development of our state. At times, awareness is not present among teachers and administrators that poor mental health can be a cause of scholastic difficulties and even school drop-outs.
- *4th May:* The College organised a session on Macro Lesson Planning jointly attended by the Staff from both the CTEs, Shillong: the College of Teacher Education (PGT) and St. Mary’s College of Teacher Education. The Lectures on quality lesson planning was given by Prof. P.K Gupta, the Dean from the Department of Education, NEHU, Shillong.
- *11th May:* On this day the College convened a meeting of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) members consisting of the Member of the Legislative Assembly, Director CDC, NEHU and representatives from the Department of Education - NEHU, from DERT, from the Society of the Sisters of Our Lady of the Missions as well as the College Faculty Members including the Coordinator and the Advisor. They dwelt mainly on Guidelines for the Creation of IQAC, its Composition and Functions as well as on the Recommendations/Suggestions for follow-up action given by the NAAC Peer Team.
- *12th – 13th July:* Ms Darihun attended the General Education Quality Analysis/Diagnosis Framework (GEQAF) Workshop at DERT, Shillong. Acquaintance with GEQAF Tools, Modalities of collection of evidences from stakeholders and Finalisation of action plan for the state were the main topics of the programme.
- *29th October - 18th November:* Mrs. Sharmistha Purkayastha, Lecturer in English attended a refresher Course conducted by the ASC, NEHU.
- *5th – 9th November:* Mrs. C. Kharlukhi, Lecturer Chemistry and Mrs. I. Marwein, Lecturer History participated in the Orientation Programme of Master Trainers under RMSA who in turn shall impart training to Secondary Teachers in the respective districts. This has been chalked out in collaboration with NCERT, NERIE & DERT at DERT, Shillong.
- *7th - 27th November:* Ms Dianghun Shullai, Lecturer in Khasi attended a Refresher Course conducted by the ASC, NEHU.
- *19th November - 9th December:* Mrs. Inrilin Marwein attended a Refresher Course conducted by the ASC, NEHU on History.

- *15th December:* Our Institution hosted the programme on ‘Teach Peace to Reach Peace’ organized by the team of teachers led by Mrs. Indrani Ganguly, Principal, Shri Shikshayatan School, Kolkata. It looked at ways in which peace can be actualized within schools as well as organize some student activities to engage students to think about active ways to support world peace. All our staff members participated in it.

The feedback given by the students was analysed and discussed by the principal with the individual teachers. As family spirit exists in the relationships between the Management and the Teachers and between the Teachers and the Student-Teachers, the exercise was carried out in a spirit of openness and considered as a means for self-improvement.

The construction of the College Canteen and the Auditorium has been completed while that of the Badminton Court is still in progress.

27. Technology upgradation:

The College maintains a computer technician as well as an electrician who regularly carry out and upgrade the technology as and when necessary.

28. Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students

- All teachers are computer-literate and they are provided with separate facilities to access the internet in the Staff room itself. Few of them are Master Trainers in the field.
- Computer laboratory and internet facilities are made available to students

29. Financial aid to students:

- The students of scheduled caste (SC) and scheduled tribe (ST) receive Post-Matric Scholarship (PMS) from the Central Government through the State Government.
- The In-service Teachers enjoy their salary from the State Government.

30. Support from the Alumni Association and its activities:

The Alumni Association of St. Mary's College of Teacher Education (AASMCTE) still needs to expand. A good number of them are presently serving as heads of institutions and administrative heads in other walks of life. They often conduct their recruitment drives through our College or take suggestions while assessing recruits. In collaboration with the College, they also provide information regarding job availability.

The Alumni of the College frequently gets the update from some of the popular Networking - site.

31. Support from the Parent-Teacher Association and its activities:

Many Student-Teachers come from distant places therefore during the year Parents/Guardians visit the College whenever the need arises particularly at admission and examination times during which familiarization with the aims, objectives and activities of the College and the quality-services the College renders for their wards are made known to them. Parents and Teachers are very supportive of one another and their activities.

32. Health services:

There are two hospitals at walking distance from the College where health services are available. In order to combat minor problems, the College will arrange for an on-call doctor from the neighbourhood as well as providing First-Aid and simple medicines for emergency.

33. Performance in sports activities:

Sports activities are organized during the College-Week. Due to time constraint and the hectic programme for the course, the students can get involved only in very limited activities. Besides, the timings of such events do not facilitate participation by the student teachers.

The College will be getting a part-time Physical Trainer in the near future.

34. Incentives to outstanding sportspersons:

Small incentives came under the purview/plan of the College at the end of the academic year. It was given in the name of *prize distribution* and the cost of such expenditure is incurred by the College itself.

35. Student achievements and awards:

The College makes all out efforts to provide quality teacher-education and encourage students to succeed by awarding them with certificates and mementoes. The result is partially satisfactory this year.

The College Authority engages Sr. Ines Thongni RNDM who is the member of the Management as a Guest-Counsellor who gives services to the students. Besides, the Principal meets them on a one-to-one basis and so also the Teaching-Staff whenever the need arises.

37. Placement services provided to students:

Most of the students who passed out from the College are generally absorbed in different institutions, government and non-government organizations inside and outside the state as well as in other countries as per records maintained by the College. Out of 97 students who passed the B.Ed. Examination 2011, the numbers of those who are already engaged in teaching and in other employments are 86 and 11 are still pursuing further studies.

The College provides opportunities for the students to make them aware of job-placements by individuals or groups.

- Providing enrichment programmes for Student-Teachers on different topics.
- Celebration of important local/national/international days
- Fostering a climate of cordial relationships among everyone at the College
- Fostering a spirit of freedom and belongingness among all stakeholders.
- Remedial classes provided by the Principal and Teachers.
- The life-style of the College marked by discipline in all aspects and the dedication of the teaching and non-teaching staff.

- SMCTE is one of the oldest Colleges of its kind having been established in 1937 as the first Women's B.T. College in the North Eastern Region.

- SMCTE provides Teacher-Education primarily for women.
- All lecturers are female.
- Almost all the members of the Faculty are alumni of the College.
- The results of SMCTE have been consistently excellent since its establishment.
- Extension Programmes provided by SMCTE for the staff and students in selected schools.
- SMCTE shares its facilities and collaborates with the Block Resource Centre to train the LP and UP Teachers.
- The College is going for Re-accreditation.
- SMCTE is proactive and dynamic.
- In spite of the heavy schedule of the professional course, the College receives bare minimum financial assistance from the government in the form of salary for the staff.
